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UNITED HEBREW OF NEW ROCHELLE GAINS NATIONAL RECOGNITION; NAMED AGAIN AMONG U.S. NEWS & WORLD REPORT'S "BEST SHORT- STAY REHABILITATION FACILITIES"

'High Performing' Rating Places United Hebrew Among Top 21% in Nation

(New Rochelle, NY—November 9, 2020)... Quickly finding a short-term rehabilitation center after major surgery or life-changing health event can be critical; it also can be a stressful process. So, finding the right facility is key. Therefore, it is welcome news for the Westchester community and beyond that *U.S. News & World Report* has named United Hebrew of New Rochelle as among the top 21% in the nation for the best short-stay rehabilitation facilities. The rating is based on ten quality measures that focus on staffing, outcomes, and processes of care, among other criteria.

Of the 15,000 facilities evaluated, 2,362 were recognized as U.S. News Best Nursing Homes in Short-Term Rehabilitation, with United Hebrew earning the coveted "High Performing" rating for its facility, which is staffed by Burke Rehabilitation therapists.

"This ranking is a testament to our hard-working staff who provide the highest quality of care 24/7 to our residents," says Rita Mabli, president and CEO of United Hebrew of New Rochelle, who noted that it was third year in a row that this highly respected organization made the nationally-known list.

The report designates nursing homes as high-performing, average or below average in the care they provide to patients spending 100 days or less at the skilled nursing facility. The rating aims to provide patients with a clearer view of the quality of care provided by nursing homes to short-stay patients in need of intensive rehabilitation or nursing services before they return home after a surgery, stroke, accident or illness.

Ms. Mabli attributes the facility's recognition to its commitment to expert and compassionate care, and its partnership with Burke Rehabilitation Hospital, which brings therapists from the renowned facility to United Hebrew.

“Highly trained staff using the latest in rehabilitation equipment is what helps our short-term patients quickly regain their mobility, balance, and independence so that they may return home as quickly as possible,” she added. “What’s more, the therapists really care. The compassion they show toward our patients complements the expert care they receive.”

The short-term rehabilitation center is part of United Hebrew’s campus of care, which includes skilled nursing, assisted living, Alzheimer’s and dementia care, independent senior housing, and home care. United Hebrew has received accolades locally, regionally and nationally for its patient-centered care, including a five-star rating from the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid, the American College of Healthcare Administrators (ACHCA) Eli Pick Facility Leadership award, and the Women’s Choice Award.
